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## **TEZPUR – ‘THE CULTURAL CAPITAL OF ASSAM’**

The word ‘Tez’ in Assamese means blood, and the word ‘pur’ means a place, a city or a town. Therefore both together the name Tezpur means a place full of Blood. On the other hand, blood is the fluid of life, sustaining our life and giving us energy to live and work.

True to its name, Tezpur has been an important hub of the literary and cultural life of Assam from the ancient times. The famous battle of Hari and Hara, the romantic episode of Usha & Aniruddha, the artistic talent of Chitrlekha are a few instances of the past glory of which Tezpur can boast of. Now, it has become an academic nerve-centre of the state, which is bejeweled by reputed Institutions like Tezpur University, Indian Statistical Institute, LGB Regional Institute of Mental Health, Tezpur Medical College and Hospital, Girijananda Chowdhury Institute of Management and Technology besides the other prestigious educational institutes like Darrang College, Tezpur College, L.G.B. Girl’s College etc.

Even in the recent past cultural icons of Assam like Roop Konwar Jyoti Prasad Agarwalla, Kala Guru Bishnu Prasad Rabha, Nata Surya Phani Sarma, Sahitya-Acharya Padma Nath Gohain Baruah and Sudhakantha Dr. Bhupen Hazarika had immensely contributed to Assam and to the entire north-east by making Tezpur as their working platform. It is perhaps due to these and some other justified reasons, Tezpur is rightly called the cultural capital of Assam.

## **LOCATION, NATURAL BEAUTY AND CONNECTIVITY**

Tezpur is located on the north bank of the mighty Brahmaputra. It is said to be the most beautiful town in the plains of the Brahmaputra valley. Having three small hills on its southern flank, and a number of natural drains called ‘Hola’, Tezpur is naturally protected from the twin problems of flood and water logging which the other towns of Assam have to face. The famous Kaziranga National Park is situated to its south east, and the Nameri National Park is located a few kilometers to its north in addition to its own adjacent hills like the Agnigarh, Bhairabpad, Bamunipahar, Ouguri and Bhomoraguri hillocks together with a number of beautiful parks within its heart. All these features make Tezpur a truly evergreen and the most beautiful town in the entire Assam valley.

Tezpur is well connected with the rest of the state and the country by road, rail and air, National Highway 15 and the National Highway No. 37 (A) connects Tezpur with all major cities and towns of Assam and of the entire North-East. Tezpur is considered as the doorstep of our beautiful neighbouring State of Arunachal Pradesh. The Districts of East Kameng, West Kameng, Tawang, Papumpare, Lower Subansiri, East Siang and West Siang of Arunachal Pradesh are easily accessible from Tezpur by road communication.

Guide lines on Admission etc. as per  
**Bar Council of India Rules & Gauhati University Regulation**

**Eligibility for Admission:**

**3yr. Law Degree Course**

**3yr. LLB Course**

**Age on Admission :** As per Bar Council of India notification, dated 31-10-13 vide Res. No. 231 / 2 -13 there will be 'no age bar' in respect of admission into LL.B course and B.A. LL.B. (Intergrated) Course.

**Minimum Marks in Qualifying Examination for Admission:**

As per stipulation of the Bar Council of India the minimum percentage of marks not bellow **45%** of the total marks in case of general category applicants, and **40%** of the total marks in case of SC, ST and OBC applicants, to be obtained in the qualifying examination, i.e. in First Degree Examination in any discipline.

Provided that such a minimum qualifying marks shall not automatically entitle a person to get admission in the college, but shall only entitle the person concerned to fulfill other criteria notified by the college concerned or by the government concerned, from time to time, for admission.

**5yr. LLB Course**

**B.A. LLB**

As per Bar Council of India (BCI) Rule, a candidate opting for admission to the Five Year Course must have :

a) Passed the Higher Secondary Examination (10+2) or an equivalent examination securing in aggregate not below 45% of the total marks in case of general category applicants and 40% of the total marks in case of SC and ST applicants.

b) No Age Bar

**Medium of Instruction:** English shall be the medium of instruction in both the law Degree courses.

**Examination and Evaluation:**

Examination consists of **(i) continuous internal assessments** through sessional examinations, viva-voce, seminars/group discussions and **(ii) end-semester examinations**. The schemes of continuous internal assessment designed according to needs of teaching-learning process in the course shall be disclosed to the students at the beginning of every semester by the teacher of the paper concerned.

**Timing of End Semester Examination:**

The end semester examinations shall ordinarily be held at the end of every semester. The end semester examinations of the **odd semesters** will be held in **December** and end semester examinations of the **even semesters** will be held in **June** every year.

**Disciplinary, Anti Ragging and Penal Provision:**

- ◆ Every student shall maintain high standard of peace and tranquility, ideal conduct, cleanliness and discipline in class room and within the college campus.
- ◆ No students shall shout and scream or commit acts of mis-behaviour with his/her fellow students.



- ◆ Ragging in any form is strictly prohibited and would attract severe disciplinary action including the punishment of expulsion from the college.
- ◆ Obscene and indecent behaviour shall invite strict disciplinary action including expulsion from the college.
- ◆ Any practice derogatory to human dignity and personal privacy are strictly prohibited. Anyone found indulging in such act would be placed before the anti ragging and disciplinary committee harassment of the college for taking immediate & appropriate strong action.
- ◆ Library is maintained and managed in accordance with the rules framed for the library. It is mandatory for all students to strictly adhere to the rules. Non-compliance shall meet strong disciplinary action.
- ◆ These disciplinary regulations are deemed to be known to all students of the college.

For any matter not covered under this regulation for semester system, the existing University Rules and the Gauhati University Act, 1947 (as amended up-to date) shall be applicable.
